I. INTRODUCTION

This guideline supersedes Guideline No. 5 issued on March 23, 2005. The following requirements are effective and apply to students enrolling in the Adult Basic Education Program on August 18, 2021, and thereafter.

II. PROGRAM DESCRIPTION AND STUDENTS SERVED

The Adult Basic Education (ABE) Program provides instruction in reading, language arts, mathematics, and computer literacy to students with skill levels below the ninth-grade level. Courses are competency based and focus on those academic and life skills students need in order to be successful in career and academic classes or fulfill personal goals.

III. IMPLEMENTATION PROCEDURES

A. <u>PLACEMENT</u>

1. Placement into ABE Reading:

*CASAS Reading GOALS** results determine a student's initial reading level and inform placement in the ABE Reading program. Students whose *CASAS Reading GOALS* scale scores are below 239 place into ABE Reading.

Students whose *CASAS Reading GOALS* scale scores are between 193 and 203 (K-1 grade-level equivalency) place into **Reading 1**. If a preliminary screening suggests that a student may be a nonreader or very low-level reader, it is not necessary to administer the *CASAS Reading GOALS*.

Students whose *CASAS Reading GOALS* scale scores are between 217 and 230 (4-6 grade-level equivalency) place into **Reading 2**.

Students whose *CASAS Reading GOALS* scale scores are between 231 and 238 (7-8 grade-level equivalency) place into **Reading 3**.

*Use the CASAS Reading GOALS Locator (104R) to determine appropriate CASAS Reading GOALS level.

2. Placement into ABE Basic Language Arts: *CASAS Reading GOALS** results and a student writing sample evaluated using the *ABE Writing Rubric* inform student placement in the ABE Basic Language Arts program.

Students whose *CASAS Reading GOALS* scale scores are below 203 (K-1 gradelevel equivalency) are placed in **Basic Language Arts Beginning**. If a preliminary screening suggests that a student may be a nonreader or very lowlevel reader, it is not necessary to administer the *CASAS Reading GOALS 900 D*.

Students whose *CASAS Reading GOALS* scale scores are between 217 and 230 (4-6 grade-level equivalency) place into **Basic Language Arts Intermediate**. Students whose *CASAS Reading GOALS* scale scores **between 231 and 238** (7-8 grade-level equivalency) place into **Basic Language Arts**.

*Use the CASAS Reading GOALS Locator (104R) to determine appropriate CASAS Reading GOALS level.

3. Placement into ABE Math:

Placement into the ABE Math program is a two-part process. Initial placement occurs at registration and is facilitated by the school counseling team. Final placement occurs in the classroom and is facilitated by the math instructor.

Part One: Initial Placement

*CASAS Reading GOALS** results determine a student's initial math level and inform placement into the ABE Math program.

• All students whose *CASAS Math GOALS* scale scores are 203 or below (K-3 grade-level equivalency) place into **Math 1**.

- All students whose *CASAS Math GOALS* scale scores are between 204 and 221 (4-6 grade-level equivalency) place into **Math 2**.
- All students whose *CASAS Math GOALS* scale scores are between 222 and 235 (7-8 grade-level equivalency) place into **Math 3**.

Part Two: Final Placement

Final placement into Math 1, Math 2, or Math 3 is determined based on the results of diagnostic assessments conducted in the classroom.
